CALL FOR PAPERS

The Fourth Annual Reserve Bank of Australia Research Workshop is to be held in **Sydney on 13–14 December 2010**. This year, the workshop is being organised in conjunction with The Australian National University. The workshop is intended to bring together academics and practitioners to discuss economic developments in east Asia, with a particular emphasis on China.

Preference will be given to papers on the following topics:

1. International trade and capital flows
2. Economic development and related policies
3. Issues related to monetary and fiscal policies
4. Financial and labour market developments

We also invite contributions in other areas of economics that address topics related to the economies of east Asia.

The workshop will include a roundtable discussion on the growing importance of China and east Asia in the global economy.

Accommodation will be provided at no cost to participants. Limited funds for travel expenses are available for academic participants. **Attendance at the workshop is by invitation only.**
