



Tenth Continuing Education in Macroeconometrics Workshop 2026

Call for Papers

The Continuing Education in Macroeconometrics (CEM) Workshop is an ongoing series. The tenth edition is co-organised with the Society for Nonlinear Dynamics and Econometrics (SNDE) and will be held on 17–18 November 2026 at the Reserve Bank of Australia's Coombs Centre in Sydney, Australia.

Following the format of previous CEM workshops, the program will combine masterclass-style keynote presentations by leading researchers with contributed paper presentations and a policy panel. Given collaboration with SNDE, this year's workshop will have a particular focus on nonlinear methods in economics and finance.
